

# Texas Salon Sanitation Compliance Checklist

*Use this editable checklist to help keep your salon inspection-ready.*

## Tools & Implements

- All tools are cleaned (remove debris) before disinfecting
- Tools are fully immersed in disinfectant for required contact time
- Disinfectant is EPA-approved and used per manufacturer instructions
- Clean tools are stored in a covered, clean container
- Dirty tools are stored separately in a labeled container
- Non-immersible tools (clippers, dryers) are wiped and disinfected after each use

## Workstations & Equipment

- Chairs are cleaned and disinfected between each client
- Shampoo bowls are cleaned after every use
- Manicure tables are wiped and disinfected between clients
- Beds (facial/lash) are cleaned and covered with fresh linens

## Single-Use Items

- Nail files, buffers, and sanding bands are discarded after each client
- Wax sticks are never double-dipped
- Cotton, sponges, and applicators are disposed of after use
- Mascara wands and similar items are single-use only

## Towels & Linens

- Clean towels are used for every client
- Used towels are placed in a covered container
- Towels are washed with hot water and detergent (bleach if required)
- Clean linens are stored in a closed, sanitary cabinet

## Disinfectants & Solutions

- Disinfectant solutions are mixed fresh daily (if required)
- Containers are labeled correctly
- Expired or contaminated solutions are discarded
- Contact time is followed exactly (no shortcuts)

### Salon Cleanliness

- Floors are free of hair, dust, and debris
- Trash is emptied regularly
- Work surfaces are clean and organized
- Walls, ceilings, and fixtures are maintained and clean

### Waste Disposal

- Covered trash containers are available at each station
- Waste is removed daily
- Sharps (if applicable) are disposed of properly
- Used materials are never left exposed

### Personal Sanitation

- Hands are washed or sanitized before and after each client
- Gloves are worn when required
- Client skin is cleaned before services
- Cuts or abrasions are properly covered

### Storage & Organization

- Clean and dirty items are clearly separated
- Products are stored in labeled containers
- No clutter that could cause contamination
- All tools are protected from exposure

### Daily Inspection Readiness

- All sanitation procedures are followed consistently
- Staff understands sanitation requirements
- No shortcuts are taken during busy periods
- Salon is ready for inspection at any time
